


CRITICAL CULTURAL PRODUCTION ON THE ARTISTIC AND EDUCATIONAL PRACTICE TODAY

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The proliferation of contemporary art museums and galleries leads us to reflect on their target audiences: to whom they are directed. The education departments of these institutions also add the how. In this **Symposium on Education and Contemporary Art**, we shall attempt to reveal educational praxis as critical cultural production to be generated in all creative areas: curating and/or exhibiting; artistic product and process; and within the context of the community and audiences.

Moreover, we strongly uphold the importance of professionalising our work; uniting efforts to create a network through which experiences can be shared and new processes can be generated between critical ways of teaching and art of the present. Toward this end, alongside the lectures and debate sessions, we have organised the **1st Profesional Forum for Contemporary Art Museum Educators** aimed at establishing a basis for defining and strengthening our work through the exchange of experiences.





Friday, 18 9:30 OPENING PRESENTATIONS.

Pedagogical collaborations. Artists, educators, curators and audiences.

The greatest way to traverse the boundaries delimiting a museum and the position of the things and people composing it, is through a collaborative educational project. Curators, artists and audiences pioneer this transgression and begin a confine-blurring process. In this interchange, the process becomes engulfed by these questions, giving way to the emergence of new modalities for approaching the artistic project and the teaching and curatorial practices.

Visual artist whose work looks into history, social thought, perception, fiction and academic language, he was Director of the Education Department at the Solomon R. Guggenheim (1998 - 2005) and currently directs the MOMA educational programmes (New York).




Transducers; Collective Teaching and Spatial Politics is a cultural project aimed at researching and boosting initiatives where artistic practises, political intervention and education intermingle freely through the work of interdisciplinary groups. This multifaceted project includes launching seminars and training workshops, establishing and displaying a relational archive, initiating projects with local agents and editing various publications. The project was set underway by the José Guerrero Centre of Granada.

Artists' Collective (members: Laura Cardona, Ester G. Mecías, Cèlia Prats, Meritxell Romanos and Marta Xibillé) which launches projects for dialogue, education and the diffusion of artistic creation. They take on the role of mediators to generate, through space and words, a relational space where working methodologies can be examined, offering a critical gaze. Their educational programme has been running at Can Xalant, Mataró (Barcelona) since 2008.

13:30-14:30h. Round Table:. Victor del Rio (independent curator and art critic, he teaches at the Fine Arts Faculty of the University of Salamanca. Head of the Education Department of the Patio Herreriano Museum until 2008) and Belén Sola (Director of DEAC MUSAC). Discussion on framework experiences with participants.
